The Chairman welcomed everybody to the meeting.

1. MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF 21.2.2011

2. REPORTS OF THE SPORTS GROUPS

- <u>2.1. Tennis Club</u>. Miss Booty reported that the club had enjoyed a very good season. The Club had received a grant from Active Norfolk that had enabled it to pay its affiliation fee to the Lawn tennis Association and to subsidise fees for its senior citizen members. There were some new members. The club was concerned about the tree adjacent to the courts and it was agreed to ask Broadland District Council about its removal. It was not possible to indicate the likely level of fees for the 2012/3 season as the Council had not yet considered them.
- 2.2. ATV Bowls Club. Mr Jones reported that the open afternoon to recruit new players for afternoon leisure bowls had been successful, also helped by a grant from Active Norfolk, and that leisure bowls would continue in 2012. The Club was delighted with the new building.
- <u>2.3. Cricket.</u> Mr Cook had sent a written report. The meeting wished to congratulate the Club on its promotion to the Cricket Alliance
- <u>2.4. Junior Football Club.</u> Mr Brown reported that the last season had been very positive with success over all age groups. The Presentation weekend and the Five a Side Tournament weekend had both been very successful. For the current season there had been a good intake of new players in the younger age groups and the Club had not increased it subscriptions and membership was, in fact, the cheapest in the Norwich area.

The Club had just signed a partnership agreement with Wroxham Football Club that would allow shared use of trainers and facilities at Trafford Park, with floodlights and 'joined up' events.

Mr Brown said that it was very doubtful that the Club would wish to continue the use of its five a side weekend facilities for any celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in 2012.
