Safer Neighbourhoods

The SNAP Panel has met every 3 months at either Spixworth, Sprowston or Old Catton. The next meeting in Old Catton will be on Monday 20th April 2009 at 7.30 pm at the Great House Training Centre, Age Concern, St Faiths Road. As always residents are invited to attend and express their views and concerns about problems, like crime, vandalism or anti social behaviour in the Villages. The SNAP Panel will then prioritise its activities for the next three months. At the last meeting, held at Spixworth, just 2 issues were prioritised – problems with serious anti social behaviour at the Sprowston Retail Park and speeding at Buxton Road, Spixworth. Church Street Recreation Ground

The MUGA is well used both informally and for netball and floodlit football training. The under 9s area must the best play area around with all its lovely new equipment and surfacing. The adult fitness equipment is enjoyed by all age groups; the children use it very innovatively! There are new 'big' swings as well. All this has been paid for by the developers of the sites at The Paddocks and Lavare Court along with grants from Biffaward, Broadland District Council and the Paul Bassham Trust. Some of the money has been saved to pay for future maintenance of these wonderful facilities.



Catton Park

The capital work at the Park has progressed. It was planned to repaint the gates and railings at Oak Lane but serious defects were found resulting in delays and the need to seek funding for the work. The gates may have been replaced by the time you read this. The gates will normally be closed, you can get into the Park through the 'kissing gate' close to the main gates or any of the other entrances.

Teams of volunteers have been a great help. A large group of foreign and very hardworking young people cleared large areas in October. A more mature group planted many shrubs and plants in January, fortunately on a fine day! If you or an organisation you are involved with would like to volunteer please let us know, there is always work to be done and (I am told as I sit in my warm office) it is a lot of fun!



A small survey of users of the Park was carried out during the November half term. It was very pleasing to hear how much the Park is appreciated! The view of 193 people were obtained, 80 lived in Old Catton, 29 in other parts of Broadland and 61 in Norwich. (Everybody did not answer all the questions so the numbers do not balance.) Some suggestions were made but, actually, the provision of toilets and a pitch and putt course are just not feasible. Many people stressed the need to continue to keep the Park as it is now.

Churchyard

You may have noticed the Churchyard has been extended slightly towards Garrick Green thanks to the generosity of a neighbour who gave a strip of land. The Council and the Parochial Church Council have provided some fine railings to form the new boundary. The Church will use this land for cremation plots.

Old Catton Cricket Club

Founded in 1868, Old Catton Cricket Club has a very long and proud association with the Parish of Old Catton. Originally playing in the grounds of Catton Hall the club has grown over the years and now puts out three sides competing in the Norfolk Cricket League on Saturdays, one side playing friendly matches on Sundays and a midweek team that last year made it into two semi-finals of prestigious competitions. The First XI (Division 2 of the Norfolk Cricket League) and the Second XI (Division 5) play their home matches at Old Catton Rec with the Third XI playing at Sprowston Rec.

We are always happy to hear from prospective new players, and with the three Saturday sides playing at different levels we can usually accommodate players of all abilities. We are a very friendly club, and as we are sponsored by the Whalebone PH we can always be found there on a Saturday evening in the summer!

Extensive pre-season indoor practice sessions are in place, and any potential new members will be warmly welcomed at these sessions.
