The Neighbourhood Plan

The Parish Council is working to produce a Neighbourhood Plan for Old Catton and has established a Steering Group, which is mainly made up of local residents.

There have been a number of community consultation events, which we hope local residents have found informative. From the ideas and comments made at these events the 'Vision and Objectives' have been agreed and detailed activities are now underway to pull together specific outcomes.

We are pleased to report that the Parish Council has successfully secured a grant from Central Government to help fund the costs involved and has made a further application for grant funding to Broadland District Council.

The Chairman's Report

This year has been an extremely busy and challenging year! The Parish Council has almost completed its project at Lavaré Park and some excellent results have been achieved. Old Catton Junior Football Club have signed a 50 year lease for the park. A brand new Under 9s play area has been established in a new part of the park which was chosen by the residents of Austin Way. There will also be a wildflower meadow planted in the coming months. Please note that the funds for this project has not come out of your council tax but were funded by Section 106 monies received from the developer of Austin Way.

I am delighted to report that Melanie, the Clerk is still working well for the Council and the Community and has just recently signed a ten year contract with the Parish Council. The Parish Council takes the training of all its staff seriously and has recently invested in all staff being trained in First Aid, Health and Safety, Manual Handling, Defibrillator and Fire Safety. The Parish Council has also stipulated that the Clerk must undertake a university course called Community Governance. This course spans over a period of six years and focuses on the way in which different people and organisations work independently and in partnership, making decisions that affect life in a local community. In the long run this course will benefit both the Council and the Community. I would also like to welcome Colin Franklin to the staffing team as Church Street Recreation Ground Supervisor and I sincerely hope that he has many happy years working for the Council and Community.

After much discussion it was resolved on 1 July 2014 that the Parish Council would become Sole Trustees of Catton Park Trust and become responsible for the day to day management and maintenance of the Park. Catton Park Trust received a transitional grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to look at the long-term sustainability of the park and with this in mind the Trust must look at the following points to ensure that the Park is viable to all users and that it can be self-financing in the future.

- Re-design the current website page to include social media. The idea of this is to make the web page much more user friendly and to allow for users to interact with the Trust and possibly donate to the Trust.
- Create a ten year business plan which will include a communication strategy and a management and maintenance plan of the Park.
- Increase child and family friendly activities. In particular to engage further with local schools and produce Teachers' Packs on the Park for Key Stages 1 & 2.
- Look at the publicity and promotion of both the Park and Hayman Lodge and develop a large scale events programme as a way to providing the Park with an income.
- Concentrate on recruiting, training and supporting volunteers.
- Develop the park to a heritage audience.
- Develop a plan to make the Park user friendly for both dog owners and non-dog owners.

We will undertake the development of a Neighbourhood Plan for Old Catton to help shape the future of the Parish

As part of these points of action I am pleased to report that a Volunteer and Events Officer has been employed on a 12 month fixed term contract using funding from the transitional grant to implement the action plan, with the full support and resources of the Trust and current staff.

The Parish Council also resolved to undertake the development of a Neighbourhood Plan for Old Catton. This plan will help shape the future of the Parish and the community has been involved from the outset with leaflet drops to every household and workshops being held between January and March of this year. I am so pleased with the results that are being achieved through this process and how the community is getting involved in the parish's future.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow councillors and the Council's staff for all their work during the year.

Parish recycling

Many of you will be aware that the Broadland Recycling Service has improved since I October 2014. What you may not be aware is that Catton Park receives a revenue from all the bottles that are recycled at Morrisons. In 2014 this generated around £4,000 of much needed funds towards the running of the Park.

Sadly the Parish tonnage has dropped by 80% since Broadland's improved services. If this continues it will no longer be viable to keep the bins at Morrisons and the Parish risks losing £4,000 of income for the Park. Please reconsider your recycling – 'think community and help generate income for a good cause'.

Community Speed Watch - request for volunteers

Are you tired of drivers not sticking to the speed limit around Old Catton? Do you have some spare time that you might be able to offer to help tackle the problem of speeding in our community? Would you be interested in taking part in a Community Speed Watch?

Old Catton Parish Council would like to set up a Community Speed Watch scheme in Old Catton and needs volunteers. After receiving full training and with the full support of the Parish Council, teams of volunteers are issued with a speed radar gun, two Community Speed Watch sighs and reflective jackets. The volunteers then carry out speed checks in 30 and 40 mph limits working to Norfolk Constabulary's guidelines.

All returns are logged with details such as vehicle registration, make, model or colour of vehicle. The completed returns are then forwarded to the Safety Camera Partnership team who obtain the registered keeper details. Any registered keepers who vehicles are observed breaking the speed limit will have their details recorded and will receive a warning letter.

Persistent offenders will be notified to Roads Policing and the local Safer Neighbourhood Team for police enforcement action.
